Subject: Plaintiffs Response to change of hearing date request

The Plaintiffs in this case request that hearing date stay as is, Thursday September 5th, 2019 at 6:30PM PDT.

Bylaw 14 Section 5 allows the committee at least 10 days notice of all parties. The current date set by the committee meets those minimum requirement.

The Plaintiffs have chosen to make this appeal with the explicit intent that there would be 10 days notice, and up to 2 days of deliberation factored into their timing of this appeal. The Plaintiffs were very explicit in when and why they submitted this appeal when they did.

As it currently stands, the Plaintiffs will have up to 48 hours to appeal the motion in questions outcome, which is a suspension of their membership, after a decision in this matter is reached by the Judicial Committee. That motion requires an appeal to the Judiciary Committee no later than September 9th, 2019 at 11:59PM. Changing the current appeals hearing date to September 17th will put addition relief options out of reach for Plaintiffs, should the Judicial Committee not rule in their favor on the current matter.

While the Judicial Committee may not want to factor other time sensitive matters into their process, the Plaintiffs still seek to keep the date as is, given that it is currently complying with all bylaws requirements, and arrangements have already been made by Plaintiffs to be present and prepare at the current date and time selected.

Should the Defendant and interested parties, all of whom are Executive Committee members, feel they absolutely require 14 days, any one of them can put forward a motion to the Executive Committee to suspend the rule, and extended the 30 day appeal deadline after September 17th, 2019. This would be a show of good faith that this additional time needed is for preparation, and not intentionally holding this hearing after the 30 days has been exhausted in the other matter.
